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Squatters Occupying Home of Murdered UC Berkeley Professor

BERKELEY, California — On or about July 4, 2025, Przemyslaw Jeziorski (PJ), was murdered by plot driven by ex-wife Konstantina “Nadia” Michelidaki, outside of her Athens Greece home. The shooter was her then live-in boyfriend. PJ was on his way to Nadia’s house for a court-ordered visit with his twin children. The parties had been engaged in a contentious divorce and custody battle in multiple international courts over the several years prior to PJ’s murder, including domestic violence allegations. On June 4, 2026, Nadia was found dead in her prison cell in Athens, Greece, due to apparent suicide. Their two twin children are now orphans in the custody of PJ’s brother Łukasz Jeziorski.

PJ and his ex-wife Nadia owned multiple properties and businesses, including 1998 Marin Avenue in Berkeley, California, which they used as an Airbnb prior to PJ’s murder. PJ ran the Airbnb from California and regularly cleaned and visited the property until his death. Łukasz Jeziorski, inspected the house personally in September 2025 finding it in order. The last known inspection of the house was around Thanksgiving week of 2025, where it was found unoccupied.

On or about December 4, 2025, neighbors heard a disturbance at the property suspecting a burglary. A woman at the Berkeley house contacted with police and reported that a burglary had taken place. Based on information and belief, this is the date the squatters gained entry, reporting their own burglary to police to establish their occupancy. They are currently protected by law as tenants even though they gained entry criminally.

This issue tracks the Hulu show: Squatters Get the F*** Out of My House!. Using a loophole in California Law, the 1998 Marin Berkeley squatters claim to have a contract for rent drafted with PJ’s murderer who was in custody in a prison in Athens Greece at the time of the alleged lease date. Even though it is a clear impossibility, the Court will not presently act to evict and the police currently refuse to remove them under color of a California law that needs to be changed. Nadia could not have entered a lease with these criminal squatters as she had no access to computers or English-speaking agents that would enable her to complete such a contract. On the date the squatters were discovered one was arrested for other crimes.

These squatters are taking advantage of orphan children that have a right to this property, and a system protecting their crimes. Since then, neighbors of the property have reported the squatters to be stealing from the children by selling items from the home. After reporting these crimes, the police failed to act. The squatters were also reported to have damaged a historic 100-year-old wall adjacent to the property amounting to thousands of dollars in damage. The city and police have also failed to act to hold squatters accountable. We are asking for help from the public regarding this situation.
